University. PG Course Structure comprises of 171 Core Courses, 29 Core Practical courses, 42 Elective Courses, 25 Extra Disciplinary Courses and Project work designed as per UGC norms and as per the guidelines of Bharathidasan University.

- *Dr. L. Ganesan posted queries on credits allotment assigned for core courses in UG and PG. and recommended the reconstitution of credits allotted for core paper in accordance with the UGC norms.*
- *Dr. V. Ambikapathi, Associate Professor, Department of Microbiology, A.V.V.M. Sri Pushpam College agreed and expressed his satisfaction with the credit assigned for Core courses as proposed in the resolution without any further modification.*
