The Institution follows the curriculum framed by the parent University. The College does not make any change in the curriculum as it is an affiliated College. However, feedbacks on the curriculum given by the stakeholders and the views presented in the Staff Council meeting of the College are submitted to the University through the members of Board of Studies. Teaching quality is enhanced through structured feedback systems. In addition to formal feedback, individual faculty members also obtain informal feedback from students, review them and use them for improving their performance. The infrastructure and transport facilities of the College are satisfactory according to the Student's and Parent's view.

1.4 Whether there is any revision/update of regulation or syllabi, if yes, mention their salient aspects.

The syllabi are prepared and revised by the affiliating university periodically. The last revision was carried out in 2010-2011. The syllabus for Value education for UG Programmes was revised in 2015- 2016. The syllabi for all the I year UG and PG Programmes are to be revised in the academic year 2016-2017 as per the guidelines of the UGC. The members of the Board of studies participated and gave suggestions in the meetings held at the University.

1.5 Any new Department /Centre introduced during the year. If yes, give details.

Software Development Council (SDC) has been constituted to impart skill and train the students in designing and development of application softwares. The Council instructed the Departments of Computer Science, Computer Applications and Information Technology to motivate the students to have hands on training in Software Development to complete successfully their Post Graduate students' projects. The Students were assigned local need based projects and they completed the projects successfully, which were very well appreciated.

New innovative course entitled "Post Graduate Diploma in Big Data Analytics" (PGDBDA) was proposed by the institution to the Parent University (Bharathidasan University, Thiruchirappalli) with required syllabi, which have been duly approved by the University. The PG Diploma Course is to be commenced from the academic year 2016-2017.

***Details of Interdisciplinary Courses**

The Parent University (Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli) has prescribed 11 Skill Based Elective courses. The Students of different UG Programmes are given freedom to choose any one of the courses.

Each Department (Totally 12 UG Departments) of the Institution offers two Courses as Non Major Elective Courses and the Students of different UG Programmes (11) are given freedom to choose any two Courses as the Non major elective of their own interest. Thus horizontal mobility and Interdisciplinary options among different Courses are ensured.

The Students of all UG Programmes have the freedom to choose either M.B.A. or M.C.A. (with Mathematics as one of the Subjects) besides the Core subject. Thus vertical mobility has been ensured.

6.2 Does the Institution has a Management Information System

- Management Information System (MIS) has been implemented for Fee Collection, Scholarship, Admission, student data, feedback system, pay roles, library learning resources such as books, journals e-resources, etc., and accessing, issue and return are managed through software package (OPAC)
- Public Address System (PAS) has been established for the transmission of information to the students
- Circulars are transmitted through internet towards paperless information initiative

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Curriculum is designed and structured by the parent university. The contents of the curriculum are revised by the concerned board of studies appointed by the university and forwarded to the affiliated Colleges. Members of the faculties of the Department of Microbiology and Biochemistry are members of the Board of studies. They involve in the curriculum design, revision and restructuring in their respective discipline
- The institution has started an advanced Post Graduate Diploma programme in ‘Big Data Analytics’ with required syllabus, which has been approved by the parent University. The programme is to be commenced from the academic year 2016-17

- The institution is an affiliated college. It follows the curriculum prescribed by the university. However, 4 diploma and 11 certificate courses are conducted by the institution, and the curriculum has been designed by the department concerned
- Besides the curriculum contents prescribed by the parent University, the institution has adopted the following strategies to improve the curriculum with specific course contents
 - For the I year UG students, intensive bridge course is conducted by the respective departments.
 - Spoken English classes are conducted on alternate Saturdays for the first year UG students.
 - Language Lab for the First Year PG students is conducted in order to enhance the Listening and Speaking skills.
 - Skill oriented programmes such as edible mushroom cultivation, vermicomposting, and biofertilizers production are conducted by the department of Microbiology.
 - Extension activities taken up by the students of all the departments inculcate the sense of social responsibility, besides the programmes of NSS, Rotaract Club and Student Exnora
- Glossaries are prepared by each department for the technical terms used in each subject

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Besides conventional chalk and talk teaching practices, the institution adopts innovative teaching methods such as Power Point Presentation, ICT enabled teaching practices using computers, internet and ‘Smart Boards’. The said objective has been fulfilled by establishing ‘Smart class rooms’ for each department.
- The students are taken for field trips/industrial visits/internships. Students of UG Computer Science are assigned with group projects, and the students of PG are assigned with individual projects as part of the requirements for the programme. The project works give them practice on understanding, designing, planning, budgeting, analytical skills and implementation.
- Learning skills of the students are improved by exposing the students to ICT enabled teaching learning processes. LSRW skill development programmes, and communication skill development programmes are conducted, which enhance the learning skills of the students. Teaching- learning outcome are determined on the basis of the performance of the students in the university examinations. Periodic

assessments are made, slow learners are identified and their learning skills are improved by conducting remedial and coaching classes.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examination

- Since the institution is an affiliated one, the examinations are conducted as prescribed by the parent university, and on the basis of the guidelines for the conduct of formative and summative assessments
- The formative assessment of the students is a continuous process. Two tests, five assignments and seminar/quiz are conducted throughout the semester, and attendance of the student per semester are used as yard stick to assess the performance of the students. Summative examination of the students is conducted at the end of the semester as per the schedule of the parent university and the question papers supplied by the university
- The institution takes extra efforts to improve the performance of the students in the summative examination by conducting periodic online tests. The department of English conducts proficiency test for all the UG students. The Departments of humanities conduct skill oriented tests in the concerned subjects

Evaluation

- The students' progress in learning the subject is periodically assessed on the basis of their performance in the tests conducted by the institution. The periodic tests help to evaluate and to identify the slow learners and also improve their performance in the summative examination through coaching and remedial classes.
- The performance of the students in the summative examination is evaluated by the external examiners appointed by the parent university. The practical skill and the projects are evaluated by the external examiners appointed by the parent university. The practical skill and their involvement of the students in designing, planning, implementation and drafting are also assessed by the staff-incharge as a continuous process.

The R & D cell organized programmes to create awareness, promote and motivate the faculty and students on the

- ix. Training on biocomposting, vermicomposting, edible mushroom cultivation and micronutrients by STET Bio-Floral Products Development and Research Centre and Tissue culture and Biominin laboratory, and
- x. Hands on training in the modern instrumentation techniques like Gas Chromatography, HPLC, Semi Auto Analyser, Atomic Absorption Spectroscopy, UV-VIS Spectroscopy and Bioreactor to make the students readily employable in various private and public industrial and academic institutional laboratories

- The college has a well defined policy with regard to the appointment of staff, training and development, and extending support to their individual growth. Any issue related to the staff is presented by the Principal in the Management Council Meeting
- Individual achievements of the teachers are recognized, appreciated and suitably rewarded by the Management
- Adequate opportunities are extended to the staff members for their individual accomplishments. Necessary concessions and provisions are made available to the staff to encourage them to further improvement of their qualifications and quality of teaching
- Capacity building training programme and Faculty Development Programme were organized for the faculty and non-teaching staff to enhance the work efficiency

Students

- The students council and class representative meetings are being held regularly and the Principal obtain feedback on their needs, teaching-learning process and infrastructure of the college
- Special training programmes like spoken English, imparting and enhancing employability skills were carried out for both Undergraduate and Postgraduate Students.
- Self development, Student's empowerment, Health and Hygiene awareness programme were also organized for the students. The counselling centre extends its counselling and special lectures to the students in the neighbouring schools and the village people.

Non-Teaching Staff

Selected candidates are appointed on a permanent basis with one year probation.

Best Practice I

Title of the practice

“Efforts to improve the employability of the students”

Goal

To enhance the employability of the students towards empowerment of the entitled students of the institutions.

Context

Soft skill and skill in the comprehensive idea and application of mind in finding solution to the problems is the need of the hour. It needs inquisitiveness, curiosity and knowledge in the recent developments in the subjects, especially in science. For example, Computer Science and Information Technology are dynamic and fast expanding subjects. Hence to improve the employability of the students of science and commerce, one year programme on “Big Data Analytics” has been introduced as a Post Graduate Diploma Programme, as a strategy to achieve the goal, and as a pilot programme.

Practice

One year Post Graduate Diploma programme has been proposed for the PG students besides their regular programme. It is one of the value added programmes conducted by the institution. The programme is to be introduced from the academic year 2016-2017, which includes courses on recent developments in the computer science and applications

and to satisfy the requirement of IT industries. The programme includes two semesters, 6 courses, 3 practical courses and project. Internship and project guidance from the reputed companies are assured. This satisfies the advance learning in computer science and job requirements. Job is assured for those successfully complete the course.

Evidence of success

“Big Data Analytics” is a developing and emerging area in computer science. The demand of human resource in this area is relatively high. In this context an international conference on “Big Data Science and Analytics” was successfully organized. The conference provided exposure to the recent developments in the subject. Arrangements have been made for providing job offer letters on the day of admission itself.

Problems encountered and resources required

The physical infrastructure such as class room, laboratory and computers and required softwares had been problems encountered for launching the programme. The problems were effectively addressed by the management. The other resources required had been trained human resource. The management deputed the selected teachers to undergo the programme and also advised the department to outsource the experts wherever/whenever required. Thus this problem has also been solved.

Best Practice II

Title of the practice

“Enhancing the research and development through international industry collaboration”

Goal

To promote research and development of the institution on par with international standards.

Context

Though the institution is located in rural area the spirit of involvement of teachers and students is always high as the correspondent himself is a scientist, who always shows keen interest to promote research in the institution. The departments of Biochemistry, Microbiology and Computer Applications are recognized research departments. Various departments have forged MOUs with industries, and research activities are carried out with whom MoUs have been signed. The department of Microbiology has submitted the ‘Expression of Interest’ for international collaborative research with Russian Science Academy as facilitated by INMA with whom the institution has forged MoU.

Practice

Students' projects and research of various departments have been made as identified thrust area research, which helps for intensive research in the subject area and to bring out a comprehensive report/monograph. Further extension of research could lead to new discoveries / inventions and ultimately for patenting. Besides research and students projects the MoUs also help to have industrial visits, internships and student exchange programmes.

The proposed international collaborative research project has been planned to study fungal diversity, microbial interactions / Antibiotic interaction, microbial products development, etc.

Evidence of success

The research activities have lead to the development of two new software and one polyherbal ointment, 'Instacure' for which patenting in progress. MoUs with institution / industries helped the students to facilitate students project, internships / industrial visits instrumentation training and employment opportunities.

Problems encountered and Resources required

Since the Management is directly involved in the research and development of the institution, problems in terms of finance, men, materials, space and other resources are readily taken care off and the problems are solved.
