
























































Action Taken Report

- 1. **Infrastructure:** The library has been updated with new books and digital resources. Hostel maintenance has been scheduled, and additional facilities like Wi-Fi are being introduced.
- 2. **Teaching-Learning:** Faculty development programs on innovative teaching methods were conducted. The syllabus has been revised to include more practical sessions.
- 3. **Student Support Services:** A new counseling center has been set up, and career counseling services have been expanded.
- 4. **Extracurricular Activities:** A student club for sports and fitness has been introduced, and more inter-college events will be organized.
- 5. **Teacher student communication:** The institution has a language lab on campus. Along with the students, faculty and staff members participate on a regular basis.
